CPSC Issues Consumer Warnings on Baby Loungers, Crib Mattresses, and More

Throughout the month of July, the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) issued several public health and safety notices to consumers, warning the public to stop using products posing a range of hazards. These unilateral warnings are issued because the manufacturers have not agreed to a recall or offered a remedy to consumers:

- Juzhiann, YANLOYZW, JIKAIDA & Yieryi Combination Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Detectors: Burn Hazard; Failure to Alert Consumers to Fire.
- HTRC C240 Battery Chargers: Fire and Burn Hazards; Risk of Serious Injury and Death.
- Hush Hutting Crib and Play Yard Mattresses: Suffocation Risk and Fire Hazard; Violation of the Federal Regulations for Crib Mattresses and Mattress Flammability.
- Magnetic Chess Games sold by Maemall: Ingestion Hazard; Violation of the Federal Safety Regulation for Magnet Toys.
- Magnetic Ferrite Stones: Ingestion Hazard; Violation of the Federal Safety Regulation for Magnet Toy.
- Magnetic Ball Sets sold by Dongguan Qihangren Trade: Ingestion Hazard;
 Violation of the Federal Safety Regulation for Toy Magnet Sets.
- <u>Camzimo Bicycle Helmets</u>: Risk of Head Injury; Violation of the Federal Regulations for Bicycle Helmets.
- ZonLi Home Baby Loungers: Suffocation, Fall and Entrapment Hazards; Violations of Federal Safety Regulations for Infant Sleep Products.

July 25, 2024 CPSC; Clark Associates recalled its Lancaster Table & Seating Standard Height Plastic Restaurant High Chairs because the T-bar located at the front middle of the chair can become loose and fall or break off while the high chair is in use, posing a fall hazard to children. Units: About 27,140 (an additional ~69 in Canada).

<u>July 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; iFIT recalled its ProForm Rapid Strike 50 LB Adjustable Dumbbell Sets because the weight plates can dislodge from the handle during use, posing an impact injury hazard. Units: About 54,400 (an additional ~650 in Canada).

<u>July 18, 2024 CPSC</u>; BISSELL recalled its Steam Shot[™] Handheld Steam Cleaners because they can expel hot water or steam onto users while heating or during use, posing a burn hazard. Units: About 3.2 million (an additional ~355,000 in Canada).

<u>July 18, 2024 CPSC</u>; Sassy Baby recalled its Manhattan Toy Brilliant Bee Rattles because the wooden base can detach from the wooden rod and release the three plastic rings, posing a choking hazard to young children. Units: About 3,000.

July 11, 2024 CPSC; The Children's Pajama Sets, exclusively sold on Temu, have been recalled because they violate the flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children. Units: About 18,620.

<u>July 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Atomi recalled its Atomi Smart Heaters because they can turn on without user input, posing fire and burn hazards. Units: About 99,400 (an additional ~10,700 in Canada).

<u>July 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; The children's pajama sets, exclusively sold on Temu, have been recalled because they violate the flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children. Units: About 45,300.

<u>July 3, 2024 CPSC</u>; The SWOMOG Children's Pajamas, exclusively sold on Amazon, have been recalled because the pajama sets violate the federal flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a burn hazard to children. Units: About 27,400.

July 3, 2024 CPSC; Hatch Baby recalled its Power Adapters sold with Rest 1st Generation sound machines because the plastic housing surrounding the AC power adapter can come off when removing the adapter from the power outlet, leaving the power prongs exposed and posing a shock hazard to consumers. Units: About 919,400 (an additional ~44,352 in Canada).

July 3, 2024 CPSC; Focusee recalled its Tideway High-Speed Hair Dryers because the handheld hair dryers lack an immersion protection device, posing an electrocution or shock hazard to consumers, if they fall into water when plugged in. The CPSC has determined that hair dryers not equipped with the integral immersion protection present a substantial product hazard. Units: About 39,600.

RECALLS

<u>July 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; DGL Group recalled its Hover-1 Dynamo E-scooters because the e-scooter's brakes can fail, posing a risk of serious injury and crash hazard. Units: About 4,200.

<u>July 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; Stiger recalled its Besrey Twins Strollers because they violate multiple safety regulations for strollers, posing entrapment, fall, and

choking hazards to children. Units: About 3,045.

<u>July 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; Ophanie recalled its Large Pink Area Rugs because the mandatory federal flammability regulations for carpets and rugs, posing a fire hazard. Units: About 5,200.

<u>July 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; Grand Rapids Chair Company recalled its wood dining chairs because the chairs can shift, break or collapse, posing a fall hazard to consumers. Units: About 5,670.

<u>July 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; Razor recalled its Razor Icon electric scooters because the downtube of the recalled electric scooter can separate from the floorboard during use, posing a fall hazard. Units: About 7,300.

July 25, 2024 CPSC; Torquay eTrading recalled its Essential Values Golf Grip Solvent and Golf Grip Kits because the recalled cleaning product violates the Federal Hazardous Substances Act because it is deceptively labeled as "Safe and Non-Toxic" and lacks the required cautionary statements for petroleum distillates, posing a risk of poisoning to consumers. Units: About 26,000 (an additional ~26,000 in Canada).

July 25, 2024 CPSC; Clark Associates recalled its Lancaster Table & Seating Standard Height Plastic Restaurant High Chairs because the T-bar located at the front middle of the chair can become loose and fall or break off while the high chair is in use, posing a fall hazard to children. Units: About 27,140 (an additional ~69 in Canada).

<u>July 25, 2024 CPSC</u>; iFIT recalled its ProForm Rapid Strike 50 LB Adjustable Dumbbell Sets because the weight plates can dislodge from the handle during use, posing an impact injury hazard. Units: About 54,400 (an additional ~650 in Canada).

July 18, 2024 CPSC; BISSELL recalled its Steam Shot™ Handheld Steam Cleaners because they can expel hot water or steam onto users while heating or during use, posing a burn hazard. Units: About 3.2 million (an additional ~355,000 in Canada).

<u>July 18, 2024 CPSC</u>; Sassy Baby recalled its Manhattan Toy Brilliant Bee Rattles because the wooden base can detach from the wooden rod and release the three plastic rings, posing a choking hazard to young children. Units: About 3,000.

<u>July 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; The TonGass Pool Drain Covers, sold exclusively on Amazon, have been recalled because they do not conform to the entrapment protection standards of the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act (VGBA), posing an entrapment hazard to swimmers and bathers. (About 1,650).

July 11, 2024 CPSC; Best Lighting Products recalled its LED High Bay Light

Fixtures because the plastic pins securing the LED board can degrade, allowing the energized LED board to come loose and contact the lens or combustible materials, posing a fire hazard. Units: About 710,600 (an additional ~ 19,100 in Canada).

<u>July 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; The Children's Pajama Sets, exclusively sold on Temu, have been recalled because they violate the flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children. Units: About 18,620.

<u>July 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Children's Nightgowns recalled its Lovely Angel Children's Lace Nightgowns because the children's nightgowns violate the federal flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children. Units: About 4,360.

<u>July 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Claire's and Icing Stores recalled its Halloween Witch Hats because they violate federal flammability requirements, posing a risk of burn injuries to consumers. Units: About 5,700 (an additional ~450 in Canada).

<u>July 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Atomi recalled its Atomi Smart Heaters because they can turn on without user input, posing fire and burn hazards. Units: About 99,400 (an additional ~10,700 in Canada).

<u>July 11, 2024 CPSC</u>; Ross Stores recalled its Metal-framed Armchairs because the armchair's leg can bend or break, posing fall and injury hazards. Units: About 1,600.

July 11, 2024 CPSC; The children's pajama sets, exclusively sold on Temu, have been recalled because they violate the flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a risk of burn injuries to children. Units: About 45,300.

<u>July 3, 2024 CPSC</u>; The SWOMOG Children's Pajamas, exclusively sold on Amazon, have been recalled because the pajama sets violate the federal flammability standards for children's sleepwear, posing a burn hazard to children. Units: About 27,400.

July 3, 2024 CPSC; Hatch Baby recalled its Power Adapters sold with Rest 1st Generation sound machines because the plastic housing surrounding the AC power adapter can come off when removing the adapter from the power outlet, leaving the power prongs exposed and posing a shock hazard to consumers. Units: About 919,400 (an additional ~44,352 in Canada).

July 3, 2024 CPSC; Focusee recalled its Tideway High-Speed Hair Dryers because the handheld hair dryers lack an immersion protection device, posing an electrocution or shock hazard to consumers, if they fall into water when plugged in. The CPSC has determined that hair dryers not equipped with the integral immersion protection present a substantial product hazard. Units: About 39,600.

This service collects recalls from the <u>National Highway Traffic Safety</u> <u>Administration</u>, <u>Consumer Product Safety Commission</u>, <u>Food and Drug Administration</u> and <u>Food Safety and Inspection Service</u>. - Be careful about using hand-me-downs or buying children's products at a secondhand shop or vard sale.
